Sadly, we said goodbye to some friends this past summer. To the families I want to express my sympathy.


It is now time to rejoin the dance and catch up with friends about our summer experience. I'm looking forward to seeing you on the dance floor.

David Grant Q.C. ~ A Remembrance

Adapted from Margaret Rieger's tribute to David Grant, at his Memorial Commemoration.

David Ross Grant (August 19, 1922 – June 10, 2013), was introduced to Scottish Country dance in the early 1960s when the St. Andrew's Society added a Scottish Country dancing room to its annual ball. He embraced the traditions, discipline, and standards of Scottish Country dancing.

After George Armstrong's death, David led the St. Andrew and St. George Social Group, renaming it the George C. Armstrong Social Group in honour of his first Scottish Country dance teacher.



To David, St. Andrews was "the Mecca of Scottish Country Dancing in Scotland". After a two-week visit in 1974 and another in 1976, he attended Summer School at St. Andrews every summer for the first two-week sessions from 1978, when he received his teaching certificate, to 2003.

He was a proud ambassador of Toronto SCD. Douglas Henderson and John Drewry, both prolific Scottish Country dance devisors, created dances for him and Betty; Henderson turned one of David's favourite sayings into the dance *H.I.S.C.D.*

In Toronto, David was elected to the Executive Committee in 1971. For two years he served as Chair of the Tartan Ball and from 1975 to 1977 he chaired the Toronto Branch, which was at that time the largest Branch of the Society worldwide. He helped organize Toronto's participation in the 1976 Toronto Scottish World Festival at the C.N.E. The following year, he met Miss Milligan in Toronto while she was on one of her North American examination tours.

David supported musicians whose artistry gives us flight as dancers. Bobby Brown wrote: "my thoughts immediately go to the many times I have asked for their [David and Betty's] assistance and advice through the years. My requests were always granted with kindness and enthusiasm." Similarly, he supported the making of *Elma's Tunes*, Stan Hamilton's records, and *H.I.S.C.D.*

A memorable occasion occurred last September (2012) at the Erin Mills Celebration Dance for both the 40th Anniversary of the Erin Mills group and David's 90th birthday. The extended Grant clan, young and old, took to the floor to dance Betty's dance, *Bedrule*, with their friends gathered in celebration.

David was a dedicated dancer and a respecter of Scottish Country dancing traditions. He,

along with Betty, was honoured formally as a Scroll recipient and as a Tartan Ball guest in 1978 and 2000. "Dancing is friendship set to music" was his response when he learned he and Betty were awarded the Society's Scroll of Honour.



the Tartan Ball Convenor. I was a television producer for 25 years, so the skills learned there will assist me with preparations for the Tartan Ball.


My other interests include keeping up with three active 20 something kids, the dog, and my non-dancing friends and family.

Scotch Mist? Scottish Accent? Laird Explains. . .



Ken Adamson writes: Most Scottish Country dancing groups cease dancing in the summer. So when Barbara and Michael Taylor, Glenna MacDonald and me contacted the Estonian group, we were surprised that the group would be dancing during our fiveday visit in July. Only later did we learn they had graciously convened the evening of dance — especially for us!

When we arrived, their hospitality was overwhelming. The eight young dancers greeted us with fruit and other refreshments and brief sheets for the four dances: The Hazel Tree, Gang The Same Gate, The Royal Deeside Railway, and De'il Amang The Tailors. The venue was a wonderful room in the heart of the beautiful medieval city of Tallinn, the capital of Estonia. Although their understanding of English was far superior to our prowess in Estonian, the common language of dance prevailed with a spirited evening of joy and laughter.

The Estonian group is alone among the Baltic States with no groups in Latvia or Lithuania. Ingrid Velbaum-Staub is to be admired for leading and teaching her twenty dancers, including one man, in what could be termed an outpost in this part of the dancing world. She has completed Units 1 and 2 and is working on the remaining units. With her dedication, and the enthusiasm of the dancers, the future seems bright for SCD in the Baltics.

After presenting the group with two Bobby Brown CDs and with fond farewells, we left with lightness of step and fond memories of a wonderful evening. ... Ken
