Guest Instructors



Bruce Herbold began Scottish Country Dancing in 1976 in Berkeley and has pursued it avidly ever since. He began teaching in 1981 in Sacramento. In both dancing and teaching, Bruce emphasizes the social aspects of Scottish Country Dance, especially the joys of teamwork and social interaction.

Bruce has taught SCD workshop across Canada and the US. "The music, sociability, ingenuity, and fun of Scottish social dance continually inspire me."

David Newitt began folk and square dancing at Swarthmore College in the fall of 1976, then went on to learn international folk dancingHe got his start in SCD with the Delaware Valley RSCDS branch.

David moved to Berkeley in 1982 and has been dancing and teaching in the Bay Area ever since. Since earning his RSCDS teacher certificate in 1988 he has concentrated on country dancing, teaching regular Scottish and English dances, and calling American contra dances. David has taught at SCD workshop in the northwest US.



Both David and Bruce have been guest instructors at previous Aloha Winter Weekends in Honolulu, and the Band has played at every Aloha Winter Weekend since 2007. <u>Click here</u> to read more about the instructors and band.

They soon added the like-minded Heather MacKay (fiddle) to the mix. They adopted the state fish of Hawaii, Humuhumunukunukuāpua'a as their mascot, and became The

Humuhumunukunukuapua'a and Strathspey Society Band — "the world's finest Hawaiian-themed Scottish Country Dance band." Enhancing their musical talents, all four are avid dancers, and Bruce, David & Patti are certificated RSCDS teachers. They have played for the Hawaii Branch's Aloha Winter Weekend workshops since 2007. They are joined by Betsy St. Aubin on the fiddle for our 52nd Aloha Winter Weekend.
