1. Communications Received:

Dancing Etiquette and Safety:

 group members, and minimal walk-throughs. He has requested affiliation with
 the Toronto Association, which has been granted.

- The ticket is valid for the 2024-2025 dance season only (October to April).
- The ticket is only transferrable to another dancer by the winner, i.e., if a non-dancing member so wishes.
- Additional details will be sent out with membership renewal reminders in August.

- Remainders will be available for members to distribute or post in their communities and at the St. Andrews Ball practices and elsewhere.
